

What is an Adopt-A-School Program?

Adopt-A-School program is an initiative to create a school and community partnership that will positively impact student's academic achievement, attendance, and provide role models.

Impacts Sigma men have on supporting Adopt- A-Schools:

- > Improve academic performance by enriching the lives of students.
- Decrease tardiness and absenteeism.
- Promote student, parent, and community involvement.
- Increase student motivation to complete elementary, middle, high school, and attend college.
- Increase the fraternity's commitment to education.
- Give professional and personal development to students and staff.
- Participate in activities to build teamwork.





Choosing Local School(s) for an Adopt-A-School Program

The chapter Director of Education or Presidents can use the below scenario's when selecting schools to form partnerships.

- > The school is serving medium to low-income students.
- The school resources are limited.
- > The school's outside funding sources are limited.
- Sigma men or Zeta's are teaching, on administration staff, current principles or AP's or have experience working with students from different grade levels in the inner city or suburban.
- Sigma men will work with the school staff and students
- Sigma men shall support based on school approved schedule between Principal and fraternity





Guidance

- ➤ Hold discussions with outgoing program coordinator(s) or president to know what is currently established at your level.
- > Coordinate a meeting with your State Director for assistance and transparency.

High Level Task

- Attend your Independent School District (ISD)/Parish board meetings in June/July to learn key information for upcoming school year.
- Complete your ISD/Parish background check, volunteer requirements, or mandatory training.
- Meet with current or proposed Adopt-A-School principals/ lead coordinator in late July or earlier August to discuss school needs, Memorandum of Understanding (MOU), ideas of activities/events and dates, times and days for support.
- Meet with education committee in August to plan or brainstorm activities/events and suggested times & days for Adopt-A-School.
- Create a calendar with all planned activities/events listed.
- Brief and receive approval from chapter president and financial secretary in August prior to committing our services.
- Schedule a follow-up with Adopt-A-School principal/ lead coordinator to approve calendar of activities/events and sign MOU.
- Be ready to start majority activities/events in September.

Step 1: Establish a committee

- ➤ Have a clear idea of the program requirements from State, Regional, and International perspective.
 - Alumni chapters focus on Middle and High Schools.
 - Collegiate chapters focus on Elementary Schools (Collegiate advisor must be involved).
- Recruit members to volunteer on committee to assist in building the program
 a minimum of 4 or 5 members
- Establish Memorandum of Understanding (MOU), background checks, license certificates, submit paperwork, training, and other mandatory requirements.
- Determine your committee availability to volunteer in the community.
- Begin to draft a vision for the program.
- Discuss the program goals and ways to achieve them.





Step 2: Plan out activities or events

- Review current or predecessor program information.
- Brainstorm some initial ideals based upon committee input.
- Determine proposed times and dates to execute your activities or events.
- ➤ Look at budget expectations to execute the planned activities and convey to financial secretary.
- Conduct market research to ensure ideals follow State, Regional, & International standards.
- > Plan activities for the entire year, quarterly, or month.
- Form an alliance or partnership with companies and organizations to help your program.
- Meet in person with perspective business, schools, organizations, clubs, & location to discuss plan and receive approval.
 - Bring a few committee members with you





Step 3: Brief plan to chapter

- ➤ Inform the chapter on your program goals, vision, and activities or events.
- > Receive approval from chapter president on yearly/monthly plan or schedule.
- ➤ Chapter must approve required budget request or committee may conduct fundraisers.
- ➤ Make suggested adjustments to your plan or schedule from chapter input.
- Obtain buy in by all chapter leaders and members.
- Distribute the final calendar of activities or events to chapter leaders, committee, and external groups.
- Ensure your activities or events are placed on chapter master schedule for awareness and maximum participation.

Step 4: Time to execute the approved plan

- > DO NOT ALLOW ANY MEMBER TO PARTICIPATE WHO DOES NOT MEET ANY SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS.
- ➤ Publish a committee schedule to ensure members arrive NLT 10-15 minutes before start time of activity or event.
- ➤ Provide directions or take members to the locations to ensure everyone is familiar with site.
- > Coordinate with external groups to validate agreed times and dates for activities or events.
- Ensure you have curriculum material, approved background checks, parental consent, MOU's, fee's paid, etc done.
- Look, dress, and speak professional when conducting program activities or events.
- Conduct a rehearsal or dry run to prepare for presentation of material.
- Program coordinator or director must hold the committee accountable for activities and events.





Step 4: Time to execute the approved plan

- ➤ Develop templates, briefings, business listings, contacts, brochures, flyers, post items on social media.
- > Continue coordinating with internal and external locations, guest speakers, material, and participate in planned activities or events.
- > Take photos of program activities or events.
- > Program Coordinators must submit Program Implementation Assessments (PIA's) after each activity or event.
- Submit activities or events to State, Regional, and International for submissio in weekly newsletters and Crescent magazine.
- Contact local newspaper or invite television networks to your activities or events.
- Conduct joint endeavors with State, Regional, and International Program Directors to strengthen your activities or events.





Step 5: Perform self assessment of programs


- > Attend activities or events regularly to observe what is working effectively and what activities or events need adjustments.
- ➤ Welcome feedback from committee members and external groups for the during & after timeframe.
- Make adjustments to program schedules and documentation.
- May need to increase or decrease members support for activities or events.
- > Evaluate to see if there are opportunities to implement new ideals this year or wait until next year based on observation.
- Begin to put together a continuity book.






Step 6: Provide Year end documentation

- > Submit program reports to chapter presidents or collegiate advisors for annually assessment of activities or events.
- Provide State, Regional, or International a year in review report.
- ➤ Gather information in preparation to submit for State, Regional, and International awards.







Step 7: Awards

- > Submit your programs for State and Regional recognitions prior to attending the conference.
 - IHQ award chapters based on yearly report (no submission)
- ➤ Encourage SBC, collegiate, and Alumni to apply for National Foundatio , Regional, and International scholarships.
- ➤ Provide chapter financial, Science Technology Engineering Math (STEM/STEAM/STREM), and book scholarships to local high school or collegiate.



Receive donations from companies and individuals with 501(c)3 sources.



Best Practices

- > Be passionate and visionary about your work
- Planning is key ingredient to success
- > Build relationship and partnership shall follow
- Don't let circumstances become your excuse to not achieve
- > Improvements are a marathon and not a sprint
- Be the best role model and honest with kids/staff
- Consistency and commitment
- > Enjoy your labor of fruit/investment as you see it grow





Adopt-A-Schools in GCR

1. GRC Adopted schools by state

New Mexico - 0 adopted schools. 1 x collegiate and 1 x alumni chapters.

Texas - 21 adopted schools. 18 x collegiate and 20 x alumni chapters.

Louisiana - 6 adopted schools. 10 x collegiate and 8 x alumni chapters.

= 27 Adopted schools and 59 chapters

- 2. Continue to be creative while reaching our Adopt-A-Schools to assist in educating our kid through all means (in person, zoom technology, video's, teams, skype, and other electronic resources). Our work maybe small in nature but, it is making a huge impact in the lives of these children. We are the difference makers, role models, and dream builders they constantly see.
- 3. In order to receive the GCR C.Y. Thomas Adopt-A-School grant of \$500, you must have a signed MOU with a school.
 - The Lone Star State Edwin K. Miles follow the same guidelines for \$250.
 - IHQ has the same requirement for its \$500 grant.

Program Implementation Assessment (PIA's)

- Submit whenever your event is complete or the next day to keep idea fresh.
- ➤ Be precise, quantify, and ensure PIA's are clear to assist with reports & awards presentations.

Good

- Ex. Under program, you list monthly/quarterly reading or reading literacy and program goals stats, read Dr. Suess or Cat in the hat to thirty-two 2nd & 3rd grade students at Plano Elementary school to improve reading skills.
- Ex. Under program, you list and program goals stats, took 20 Adopted School students from David W Cart High school to AT&T Stadium to the College Career Combine to learn about financial literacy, branding yourself, colleges, and jobs.
- Ex. Under program, you list **HBCU Fair** and program goals stats, educate 400 Lincoln high school seniors of Houston ISD students about HBCU life, admission requirements, and college life.

Needs Improvement

Ex. Under program, you list **mentoring** and program goals stats, aspiring students to stay in school.

- Ex. Under program, you list coat drive and program goals stats, coat give away.
- Ex. Under program, you list Midnight Breakfast and program goal stats, students to network and enjoy the event.

 - Goal is at least 350 PIA's of quality work this year.




